Broccoli	<u>Piracicaba</u>	OP	2			(56 days) Broccolini type. About halfway between a heading broccoli and a broccoli raab, these succulent tender small green heads with very large beads make delightful raw eating. Very loose heads, lots of side shoots, sweet stalks. Frost and heat resistant.
Broccoli	<u>Purple Peacock</u>	OP	1			(92 days) 2½' tall, spreading 2-3'. Purple kale like leaves, stems and heads cook to a dark green or can be enjoyed raw in salads. Cold resistant.
Broccoli	<u>Romanesco Italia</u>	HL				(75 days) Lime green head. Does well in cold climates.
Brussel Sprouts	<u>Groninger</u>	HL				(95 days) These medium to small sprouts are an ideal choice for first timers. Adaptable to variable weather.

Brussel Sprouts	<u>Red Rubine</u>	HL				Colorful in cool late fall. Sweet in flavor when harvested in the fall.

Cabbage	<u>January King</u>	HL	1			(110 days) Large 3-5 lb heads. Slightly flattened with purple wrapped leaves. Very cold resistant (5 degrees)
Cabbage	<u>Ruby Perfection</u>	HYB	5			(85 days) Deep purple red. Spherical 4-6lb heads can reach up to 8lb. Great for storage (may) Very cold resistant (18 degrees)
Cabbage	<u>Tribute</u>	HYB	1			(103 days) Round 10-12 lb blue green heads 10". Large wrapper leaves, not the best for storage enjoy during fall. Great flavor for sauerkraut.
Cauliflower	<u>Amazing</u>	HL				(75 days) Easy to grow for first timers. Can harvest at baby size or fully mature (10"). White self-blanching, heads covered by large wrapper leaves. Does well in wet and clay soil.
Cauliflower	<u>Graffiti</u>	HYB	6			(80 days) Purple colored heads fades when cooked. Resists heat and drought but grows slowly in the cold.
Cauliflower	<u>Snowbowl</u>	HYB	5			(83 days) Delicate, chewable, tender, buttery, fine-textured and creamy cooked, report our tasters. For best quality, inspect your patch frequently and be prepared to harvest at the 5-6" stage when these dense dome-shaped 1½ lb heads remain very tight. Compact plant habit permits close 20-24" spacing for high yields and quick successions.

Celery	<u>Red Venture</u>	OP				(84 days) Delicious chewy stem with plenty of interior red color.
Celery	<u>Tango</u>	OP				(90 days) Grows large in close spacing. When grown fast in high temperatures and moisture they mimic a bacterial wilt. Has a smooth tender taste with near stringless stalks.

Cucumber - Pickling	<u>Little Leaf</u>	OP, O	3			(60 days) Fruits without pollination. Compact vines, small leaves leaves cucumbers visible for harvesting. High production even under stress. Smaller than traditional cucumbers. Scab resistant.
Cucumber - Slicing	<u>China Jade</u>	HL				(54 days) Long slender glossy green, sweet and seedless cucumbers. Grows well in greenhouse or garden. Fruit develops without pollination.
Cucumber - Slicing	<u>Longfellow</u>	OP, O	2			(70 days) White spined, 8-9" long and 2" wide. Crunchy skin, sweet flavor. Large yield

Eggplant	<u>Pingtung Long</u>	HYB	3			(58 days) Stress tolerant average yield. Uniform slicing, light purple, sweet, 11".
Eggplant	<u>Rosa Bianca</u>	HL				(80 days) Light pink-lavender, soft white shading, and gently scalloped form. Rich, mild flesh, no bitterness.

Greens - Chard	<u>Improved Rainbow Blend</u>	OP, O				(Baby 30 days, Mature 60 days) Blend of red, pink, white, yellow and gold stems. Grow upright for clean production and easy harvesting. Perfect for first time gardeners. Color defined as plant matures.
Greens - Kale	<u>Dazzling Blue Dinosaur</u>	OP, O	1			(60 days) Vigorous 24–34" upright savoyed lacinato-leaved kale in a range of bluish-green shades and all with a dramatic pink mid-rib. Cold hardiness, color intensifies in cool weather.
Greens - Kale	<u>Dinosaur-Nero di Toscana</u>	OP	2			(62 days) Very dark green wrinkled strap-like leaves appear almost black at a distance, looking minimalist compared with the lush curly-leaved kales. Tough leaf, can be used for microgreens. Sweet mild flavor improves with frost.
Greens - Kale	<u>Dwarf Blue Curled Scotch</u>	OP, O	1			(Baby 30 days, Mature 56 days) Standard Kale. Grows upright 12-16" plants, stand well, maintain color. Cold hardy, best fall crop. Perfect for First time gardeners.
Greens - Kale	<u>Jagallo Nero</u>	HL				(70 days) Sweet tender kale. Blue green, deep cut leaves. Ideal for raw preparations.
Greens - Kale	<u>Russian Red</u>	HL				(Baby 25 days- Mature 50 days) Stems are purple; leaves are flat, toothed, and dark green with purple veins. The plants mature medium-tall and leaves are tender compared to other kales.
Greens - Lettuce	<u>Better Devil Romaine</u>	OP, O	1			(60 days) Purple ruffled center, green tinged with purple, are crunchy, juicy and sweet with a hint of bitterness. Early spring planting, moderate heat resistance. Compact with uniform growth in crowded areas.
Greens - Lettuce	<u>Blushed Butter Romaine</u>	OP, O	1			(49 days) A combination butterhead-romaine with ruffled savoyed leaves dappled in an attractive palette of reds and greens. Crisp.
Greens - Lettuce	<u>Parris Island Romaine</u>	OP	2			(68 days) Standard greenish- white romaine. Grows upright 8-9"heads fold inward form compact centers. Bolt resistant, heat resistant.
Greens - Spinach	<u>Bloomsdale Longstanding</u>	HL				(50 days) Glossy, deep green, delicious leaves. Moderate heat resistance.
Herb	<u>Borage</u>	OP	2			(55 days) Grows densely while smothering weeds and attracting bees. Many small blue flowers that turn purple and then pink. Cooling properties, used in cough syrups or ice cubes to add flavor to water. Bushy 2-3' annual likes sun, prefers moist drained soil. will self sow. Mild cold resistance.
Herb	<u>Fennel - Perfection</u>	OP, O	1			(72 days) Modest size bulb that performs well in cool soils and moderate heat. Nearly bolt proof.

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Herb	<u>Lemon Balm</u>	OP	2			2' perennial attractive to pollinators. Yellow-green scalloped lemony leaves before plant flowers. Likes well drained soil, wet soil may winterkill more likely than the cold.
Herb	<u>Oregano - Greek</u>	OP	2			Low-growing perennial with dull green and purple leaves and white flowers.
Herb	<u>Sage</u>	OP	4			Perennial grows up to 3' with fuzzy grey-green oblong leaves and lavender flowers. Likes well drained soil can survive winter, replace every 3 years or so.
Herb	<u>Summer Savory</u>	OP	3			(70 days) Grows to 1 1/2' with narrow dark green leaves and lavender flowers. Cut often before blossoms appear. In fall, dark purple foliage and lavender flowers.
Herb	<u>Sweet Marjoram</u>	OP	2			(80-95 days) Grows to 1' with grey-green rounded leaves with sweet fragrance. Cut often to prevent flowering.
Herb	<u>Thyme - German</u>	OP	2			Perennial creeping 10-12". Attractive to pollinators, likes well drained light dry alkaline soil. Fine root system makes for difficult movement around the garden.
Herb - Basil	<u>Dark Opal</u>	OP		C		(65 days) Annual, uniform all purple Italian strain. Lilac flowers with dark red stems.
Herb - Basil	<u>Genovese(4 pack)</u>	O	1	C		(70 days) Perfect for making pesto. Leaves are smaller and finer than Sweet Basil.
Herb - Basil	<u>Lemon - Sweet Dani</u>		5	C		(65 days) Tall upright plant 30" more productive than Lemon Basil. High yields of large light green leaves. No coddling.
Herb - Basil	<u>Mammoth</u>		2			(60-90 days) Lettuce-leaf type has very large ruffled leaves suitable for rolling or stuffing. Flavor similar to sweet basil. Give plenty of space per plant so leaves can dry out after wet spells.
Herb - Basil	<u>Round Midnight</u>		5	C		(65 days) Purple Basil, with broad dark lightly ruffled serrated tender leaves. Aroma of allspice, nutmeg, and light musk. 12-14" tall, well branched. Savory with mild pungency.
Herb - Basil	<u>Spicy Globe</u>		2			(70 days) Small compact plant 8" tall. Light green, small, thin green leaves and white flowers.
Herb - Basil	<u>Thai</u>		3	C		(60 days) Strong licorice-anise basil flavor. 12-18" tall with fine-leaves and purple stems, seed heads, and flowers.
Herb - Parsley	<u>Double Curled</u>		3	C		(75 days) Long upright stiff stems, holds color well all season through repeated cuttings. Heat tolerant. Moderate cold hardiness.
Herb - Parsley	<u>Giant of Italy</u>	HL		C		(60 days) A large strain of parsley.
Kohlrabi	<u>Early Purple Vienna</u>	HL				(60 days) Delicious, cabbage-flavored bulbs that grow above ground. Purple skin and sweet, white flesh; good cooked or raw. Kohlrabi makes a real staple crop with high yields; cold hardy.
kohlrabi	<u>Early White Vienna</u>	OP	2			(58 days) Dwarf variety with short tops and medium stems. Crisp white tender flesh with a pungent taste.
Kohlrabi	<u>Gigante</u>	OP	3			(130 days) Large plant exceeding 10" in diameter and 10lb. Doesn't get woody even at such large size. Great root cellar staple. Crisp white mildly tangy flesh. Leaves and stems sweeten after a few hard frosts in fall.
Kohlrabi	<u>Kolibri</u>	HYB	4			(45 days) Purple kohlrabi, very uniform. Purple on the outside and white on the inside. An august planting will be ready in October. Very Hardy, will winter with only snow cover for protection. Moderately Cold-hardy.
Leeks	<u>King Sieg</u>	OP, O	1			(85 days) Blue- green, 6" long, 3" thickness.
Melon	<u>Asian Golden Crispy</u>	HL				(75 days) Small, oval shaped fruits. About 1/2 lb. Pale-yellow skin and tender, crisp flesh. Needs plenty of sun, and protected from strong winds and cool temperatures. Space 2-4 ft apart in rows 5-10 ft apart. Harvest when stems turn from green to brown, look for the underside to turn from a greenish white to a tan or yellow.
Melon	<u>Collective Farm Woman</u>	HL				(80-85 days) Ripen to a yellowish-gold and the white flesh are very sweet. Tolerates cool summers.
Melon	<u>Dove Ananas</u>	HYB	2			(70 days) Early maturity about 3lbs. Ivory-colored flesh very sweet tropical fruity flavor. Perfect for first time gardeners. After harvest let them sit 3-4 days to bring out full flavor. Short shelf life, perfect candidate for succession plantings.
Melon	<u>Sakata's Sweet</u>	HL				(85 days) Asian variety, small 3-4" round. Very sweet, crisp and crunchy with edible golden skins.
Melon - Watermelon	<u>Blacktail Mountain</u>	HL				(70 days) Red sweet flesh, with dark rind and weighs 8-12 lbs each. Heat and drought resistant.

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Melon - Watermelon	<u>Cream of Saskatchewan</u>	HL				(85 days) Sweet and crisp, 10 lb white watermelons.
Melon - Watermelon	<u>Sugar Baby - Bush</u>	HL				(75 days) Vines only reach around 3 ft in length, grows well in limited space. Early producer juicy and sweet 6-12 lb fruit. Deep scarlet colored flesh with dark green skin no striping.
Onions	<u>Clear Dawn</u>	OP, O	1			(104 days) Great storage option, 8-10 oz and very hard. Long-day variety.
Onions	<u>Red Wethersfield</u>	OP	2			(110 days) Large medium-firm deep purple-red with flattened globes. Pink-tinged white flesh with red concentric circles. Keeps till late winter. Long-day variety.
Onions	<u>Walla Walla</u>	OP	1			(125 days) Sweet onion. Can be wintered over. Large onions with mild flavor as soon as they come out of the ground. Not for storage.
Peppers - Hot	<u>Anaheim</u>	OP	2			(78 days) Produces 7" long fruits tapering to a point. Turn from dark green to red at maturity. Pungent, but not particularly hot.
Peppers - Hot	<u>Carrot Bomb</u>	Op	1			(74 days) Produces round 1-2" shiny bright tangerine peppers. Grows sturdy 2-2 1/2" tall plants. Heat comparable to a Jalapeño.
Peppers - Hot	<u>Chinese 5 Color</u>	HL				(84 days) Screaming-hot, with colors changing from purple, cream, yellow, orange, to red as they ripen.
Peppers - Hot	<u>Fish</u>	OP	1			(80 days) Produces 2" curving pendant fruits look like a swimming fish. Turn from white with green stripes to orange with brown stripes to red. 2" spreading bush plants, benefit from staking. Easily cross pollinated, requires more insolation than most peppers.
Peppers - Hot	<u>Jalapeno - Early</u>	OP	2			(75 days) Produces a 3X1 sausage shaped pepper. Brown netting appears as fruit ripens from dark green to dark red.
Peppers - Hot	<u>Paprika - Leutschauer</u>	HL				(80 days) Pepper perfect for drying. Short, erect plants grow medium hot paprika with a sweet aroma and crisp texture.
Peppers - Hot	<u>Poblano</u>	HL				(75 days) 3-6" heart shaped mild pepper. Plant reaches 2'. Typically used green, dried the fruit turns dark red-brown and can be ground into an authentic red chili powder.
Peppers - Hot	<u>Sugar Rush Peach</u>	HL				(90 days) Long, peach colored pepper with super sweet tropical flavor and seed brings a smoky, complex heat. Produces a high yield of peppers.
Peppers - Hot	<u>Thai Hot</u>	OP	1			(82 days) Small conical very hot peppers ripen to a bright red and stand erect above the foliage. Early pinching will produce a bushy 8" plant that can be pulled, roots and all, and hung to fry for winter use or grown inside.
Peppers - Sweet	<u>Albino Bullnose</u>	HL				(75 days) Blocky 3-4" cream colored peppers. Milds sweet flavor, ripen to a beautiful reddish-orange. High yielding, compact, dwarf plant from early summer until frost. Perfect for first time gardeners or those with limited space.
Peppers - Sweet	<u>Banana</u>	HL				(60 days) Sweet wax pepper. Fruit is tapered and reaches to 6-7" long and 2" wide. Color is a translucent ivory and ripens to a red-orange.
Peppers - Sweet	<u>California Wonder</u>	HL				(70 days) Standard green bell pepper. High yielding.
Peppers - Sweet	<u>Carmen</u>	HYB	3			(70 days) Sweet horn-shaped tapered 2 1/2 X 6" fruits (5oz). Ripen from a green to deep carmine(purple). Medium sized plants with excellent protective canopy.
Peppers - Sweet	<u>Chocolate</u>	OP	1			(90 days) Rich reddish brown 3 1/2 X 3 1/2" blocky thick-walled pepper with great sweetness and flavor. May be eaten as a green pepper with meaty, sweet, delicious and flavorful as other types of green peppers.
Peppers - Sweet	<u>Cubanelle</u>	OP	2			(80 days) Perfect semi-sweet frying pepper. 6X2" waxy yellow-green fruits turn red. Not pungent, with a high yield.
Peppers - Sweet	<u>Jimmy Nardello</u>	OP	1			(76 days) Thin-walled 8" long curved tapering pointed pepper turn deep red with shiny wrinkled skin when ripe. Sweet mild flavor, good raw, in stir-fries, especially fried.
Peppers - Sweet	<u>King of the North</u>	OP	1			(70 days) Early ripen in the north. Prone to blossom-drop in heat.
Peppers - Sweet	<u>Giant ozark</u>	OP				(75 days) High yielding 6-8" long giant red sweet bell peppers. Peppers have thick walls, sweet, and juicy. Great in salads, salsa, and stuffed. Should be staked to support the heavy yields.
Peppers - Sweet	<u>Purple Beauty</u>	HYB	1			(55 days) Nearly black skin creates incredible contrast with bright green flesh. Sets in the crown and on each limb optimizing yield. Ripens to a deep purple-red.

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Peppers - Sweet	<u>Mini Bell</u>	HL				(60-90 days) 2" trio of mini red, yellow, and chocolate bell peppers. Perfect for snacking, stuffing or pickling. High yielding.
Peppers - Sweet	<u>Mira</u>	HL		C		(75 days) Large, thick-walled fruit, that is crisp, sweet, and mild. Color ripens from a pale cream to a bright red. Smooth, sleek is bullet-shaped. Compact plant perfect for container garden.
Peppers - Sweet	<u>Shishito Takara</u>	HYB	5			(60 days) Small thin-walled peppers. Early, easy, and abundant. Produces wrinkled 1 X 3 1/2 fruits on compact well-branched plants. Typically harvested green to be roasted fried or grilled whole. Sweeten and ripen to red. Perfect for first time gardeners or those with limited space.
Pumpkin	<u>Big Max</u>	OP	4			(115 days) Pumpkins 70" around often weigh 100lb, when given plenty of moisture, fertilizer and space. Bright orange 4" skin covers a thick yellow-orange flesh. Perfect for pies. Let 1 or 2 pumpkins develop per vine for largest size. Mulch when plants are 1-2" high.
Pumpkin	<u>Howden</u>	OP, O	1			(115 days) Pumpkins with hard ridged skin and thick flesh. Standard jack-o'-lantern. Large spreading vines produce 4-6 deep orange fruits per plant. Weighing 20-35lbs.
Pumpkin	<u>Lady Godiva</u>	HL				(105 days) Yellow-orange rinds striped with green. Naked-seeded pumpkin, produces seeds without a hard shell. Seeds are ready to eat straight from the fruit or perfect roasted.
Pumpkin	<u>Lumina</u>	OP	2			(100 days) Ivory pumpkin 8-10" around, average 12 lbs with sweet yellow flesh. Stores well if not exposed to frost. Under stress may develop blue patches. Perfect for carving, painting, and eating.
Pumpkin	<u>New England Pie</u>	OP, O	2			(102 days) Standard pie pumpkin. High yielding averaging 4lbs. Cool summers reduces production about half. Ripening continues during curing.
Squash - Summer	<u>Black Zucchini</u>	HL	2			(50 days) 6" dark green skin, greenish-white firm tender flesh. A moderate yielding Zucchini. Open plant habit makes picking relatively easy. Perfect for first time gardeners.
Squash - Summer	<u>Cocozelle</u>	OP	2			(53 days) Zucchini ribbed with light green stripes.
Squash - Summer	<u>Modena</u>	HYB, O	4			(45 days) Glossy dark green Zucchini. Open upright plant habit ensures easy unscratched harvest. Mild nutty flavor and fine-grained texture. Perfect for first time gardeners.
Squash - Summer	<u>Sebring</u>	HYB	2			(50 days) Golden straight-sided cylindrical Zucchini. Grows an open plant habit for easy harvesting. Averages about 17 baby or 6 mature fruits per plant. Drought stress may produce misshapen fruits but bounce back nicely.
Squash - Summer	<u>Tromboncino</u>	OP	2			(60 days summer, 90 days winter) Tender, mild, sweet and nutty Zucchini when harvested in summer at 8-12". When the green-tan fruits grow long they are best baked as a winter squash. Should be trellised.
Squash - Summer	<u>White Bush</u>	OP	2			(50 days) High yielding, crawly plants produce 15 fruits per plot. Pick fruits when young. Handle gently to avoid scratching.
Squash - Summer	<u>Y Star Patty Pan</u>	HYB, O	3			(48 days) Bright yellow uniform scallops with pale green stars on blossom end. Harvest small for a sweet and tender squash. They are grown in an open habit with minimal spines making them easy to harvest.
Squash - Summer	<u>Desi</u>	HL				(40 days) You will be impressed by how quickly the small bush-type plants started to flower and produce loads of yummy squash. The taste is characterized by a nutty, rich flavor. It produces loads of round baseball-size fruit that is great to use as you would any zucchini! A really amazing vegetable and so easy to grow.
Squash - Winter	<u>Luffa - Dishcloth</u>	HL				A natural dishcloth. Fruit grows about 2', the vine produces clusters of yellow flowers and dark green foliage. When harvested young and cooked they taste like okra.
Squash - Winter	<u>Delicata - Zeppelin</u>	OP, O	1			(100 days) Ivory with dark green stripes, oblong, 1lb fruits. Very sweet flesh, no need to peel skin when cold they are tender and nutty. Good storage squash, the green stripes will turn orange and ivory may turn yellow during storage.
Squash - Winter	<u>Red Kuri</u>	OP, O				(95 days) Teardrop-shaped, red-orange squash with a smooth, sweet, dry orange flesh. Reliable yield with short season and great uniformity. 3-4 lbs.
Squash - Winter	<u>Spaghetti</u>	OP, O	2			(88 days) Ripen to a deep gold. Oblong fruits around 4lbs with spaghetti-like strings as the flesh. When fully ripened the fruit has a nutty flavor. Great for storage.
